#### writing style

- quirky and full of personality/voice
- specific, rather than theoretical
- · easy reading, rather than formal
- opinionated
- Length proportional to topic, but must be able to hold readers' attention; we will consider serializing longer pieces. If you're not a natural writer, we can edit and organize it, making it more fun to read. just give us the facts and tell the story in your own words. we'll do the rest.
- Pictures, charts, and other visual aids liven things up; audio files also welcome.
